GUEST SPEAKERS

Presidential Guest Speaker James Henry Webb, Jr.

James Henry Webb, Jr. is an American politician and author who represented the state of Virginia as United States Senator from 2007-2013, and also acted as Secretary of the US Navy under President Ronald Reagan from 1987-1988.

Senator Webb graduated from the United States Naval Academy in 1968 and was then commissioned as a second lieutenant in the U.S. Marine Corps. He was deployed to Vitenam where his services earned him the Navy Cross for heroism, a Silver Star, two Bronze Stars, and two Purple Hearts. After the military, Webb continued his education at Georgetown University, earning a Juris Dotor degree. He then went on to work on the staff for the House Committee on Veterans Affairs, taught at the Naval Academy, and served as Secretary of the US Navy – the first Naval Academy graduate to serve as the civilian head of the Navy.

Senator Webb is also an Emmy Award winning journalist, filmmaker, and author of ten

books. Webb's successful first novel, Fields of Fire, drawn from personal experience, tells the story of a platoon of United States Marines in late 1960s Vietnam. Reviewers hailed its descriptions of infantry life and combat. After five more novels, he wrote Born Fighting: How the Scots-Irish Shaped America, a personal view of Scots-Irish and their place in American history and culture. In addition, Webb wrote the story, and was the executive producer for, the 2000 film "Rules of Engagement," which starred Tommy Lee Jones and Samuel Lackson.

In 2020, Senator James Webb was named inaugural distinguished fellow at Notre Dame International Security Center (NDISC) which helps to bridge the gap between academia and the national security policymaker community to prepare Notre Dame undergraduate and graduate students for careers in the field.



Guest Speaker RADM (Ret) Bruce Gillingham

Dr. Bruce Gillingham holds a Bachelor of Arts in Cultural Anthropology from the University of California, San Diego, and a Doctor of Medicine from the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences. He went on to complete a surgical internship and an orthopaedic residency at the Naval Medical Center San Diego.

Dr. Gillingham has served in various positions throughout Navy Medicine since 1982, including Director of Pediatric Orthopedic and Scoliosis Surgery; Associate Orthopedic Residency Program director; and director of Surgical Services. He has also served as deputy chief, Bureau of Medicine and Surgery, Readiness & Health; commander, Navy Medicine West; commander, Naval Medical Center San Diego; deputy commander, Naval Medical Center Portsmouth; commanding officer, Naval Hospital Jacksonville, Florida; Pacific Fleet surgeon, and Fleet surgeon and director, Health Services, U.S. Fleet Forces. From 2019 to his recent retirement, Dr. Gillingham served as surgeon general of the Navy, Bureau of Medicine and Surgery.

Guest Speaker Mary Lloyd Ireland, MD

Mary Lloyd Ireland received her medical degree from the University of Tennessee Health Science Center, Memphis. She completed fellowships in Pediatric Orthopaedic Surgery and Sports Medicine at Boston Children's Hospital, Harvard Medical School, and in Orthopaedic Surgery and Sports Medicine at Hughston Orthopaedic Clinic, Columbus, GA.

Formally an athlete herself, Dr. Ireland has served in the Olympics Sports Medicine Program for many teams and also as Team Physician for University of Kentucky and Eastern Kentucky University.

An advocate for women in professional and athletic arenas, she is also a staunch supporter of Resident education, lectures extensively, and is a prolific writer and editor for numerous orthopaedic sports journals.
